Five are from China, three from Guyana but living in Suriname, one from Brazil, one from Suriname, and one from South Korea (our valedictorian). One of these is Ishwardat ("Romeo") Arjune, who is a professing member of FPC (First Presbyterian Church).

Many of these will be going on to various Colleges to pursue further studies; some to the United States, others in their home country. In their English class they made up a booklet where each one wrote of how thankful they were for their experiences and the education they had at CLA. Some had been in CLA from the earliest grades in Elementary.

I was privileged to give the graduation address. The theme was, <u>God's formula for a successful future</u>, and was based on, *For with You is the fountain of life; In Your light we see light* (Psalm 36:9).

The grade eleven class did themselves proud by putting on a great spread of food for all who attended the graduation exercises. God has blessed CLA, and it was a great joy to be a part of graduation. We trust you also see how you share in it, through your partnership with us. ### Another book shipment is on its way!

A very important part of ongoing ministry for CLA is the yearly book shipment. As some of you may know, we use an American curriculum and so all our books are from sources in the U.S.

Each year Nirmala Hamid, with help from others, does an inventory and submits an order. Then Mrs. Donnan orders the books and by the end of May I buy added materials and supplies. In June I pack it all and prepare it for shipping. Usually, by the middle of June, David Card and I drive down to Miami with a rented truck and we pack the boxes on pallets at a shipper. The shipment leaves on a Friday and arrives in Suriname in about 10 days. In the meantime Asgar Hamid gets the receiving company in Suriname to do all the paper work. This year the shipment should hopefully arrive on July 2. Then, the "fun" begins! By that I mean, the challenge to get the shipment cleared through customs. Sometimes it can take over a month to clear. It is hardly "fun" but, God willing, eventually the shipment gets to the school.

The process involves a good deal of prayer and perseverance, along with some anxiety if there are delays; since the sooner we get the books, the sooner we can get them ready for use in the new school year. Please pray for the shipment!

### The Lord provides workers for 07-08!

<u>Lance Visser</u> is from Mount Vernon, Washington. He has just graduated from College with a Bachelors in Science and will be teaching the higher Maths and Sciences, as well as one HS English course. He seemed to smile (through emails) when we asked him about being willing to teach an English course; since he had originally considered a major in English. Being able to teach the higher maths and sciences will be a great help to Rev. Hamid, who has been teaching most of them in the past. <u>So thank the Lord for this provision</u>.

<u>Tony Jakub</u> is from Maryland. He is an older gentleman who has some past teaching experience in Elementary. We are thankful that he is willing to help us with some Jr. High courses.

I am planning on travelling with them all to Suriname; leaving Miami on August 8<sup>th</sup>. Pray for them as they prepare for their work and life in Suriname.
